Jeff,

I'll work with the Mayor and see what happens.

Another possibility to get some fencing in over the next two years has just come to light. The TX Highway Commission is building a Hwy 277 bypass around Eagle Pass. This road is to start at the truck POE (eastern most POE) right at where we proposed one of our POE security fences. The road will loop from the POE to within about a quarter mile of our new station on the east end of town. We have already discussed this new road with the Highway Comm. and received a verbal agreement from them that it is a good idea to provide for a fence along the Mexico side on their right of way. We can provide a better picture of this to whomever you deem appropriate. I believe we should start looking at this now. We don't yet have a measurement, but on the map it looks like it could be about 3 to 4 miles. Maybe this fence is something we could get the State of Texas to build during the highway construction, given the right incentives.

Based on input from Eagle Pass Station and the staff, I had made several statements in the report I sent up three weeks ago regarding the fence situation.
